Keynote Speakers

Karen Daley, PhD, MPH, FAAN of Boston, Massachusetts was elected president of the American Nurses Association in June of 2010. President Daley spent more than 26 years as a staff nurse at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston. She is a past president of the Massachusetts Association of Registered Nurses and the Massachusetts Center for Nursing. President Daley has been recognized for her outstanding leadership and excellence in practice, including being recognized as a living nursing legend by the Massachusetts Association of Registered Nurses. In 2006, she was inducted as a fellow into the American Academy of Nursing in recognition of her advocacy work in needlestick prevention. President Daley holds a diploma in nursing from Catherine Laboure School of Nursing, a bachelor's of science in nursing from Curry College, a master's in public health from Boston University School of Public Health, a master's in science and PhD in nursing from Boston College.



Dr. Ann B. Hamric received her BSN from Vanderbilt University, her MS in medical-surgical nursing from the University of California at San Francisco and her PhD in nursing with a concentration in ethics from the University of Maryland at Baltimore. She has worked as a staff nurse, clinical nurse specialist, nursing administrator and educator. Currently, she is a Professor in the School of Nursing and a Faculty Affiliate in the Center for Biomedical Ethics and Humanities at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville.



Carol Taylor, PhD, RN is a senior research scholar in the Center for Clinical Bioethics at Georgetown University and a Professor of Medicine and Nursing. Carol has a PhD in Philosophy with a concentration in bioethics from Georgetown University and a Master's Degree in Medical-Surgical Nursing from Catholic University; She now works closely with health care professionals and leaders who are exploring the ethical dimensions of their practice. She lectures internationally and writes on various issues in healthcare ethics and serves as an ethics consultant to systems and professional organizations. She is the author of Lippincott, Williams & Wilkins Fundamentals of Nursing: The Art and Science of Nursing Care, which is now in its 7th edition and co-editor of Health and Human Flourishing: Religion, Medicine and Moral Anthropology and the 4th edition of Case Studies in Nursing Ethics.

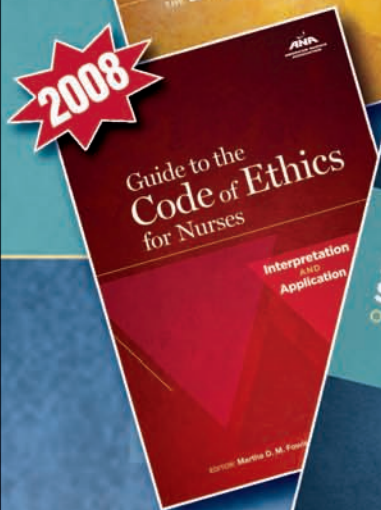
